<i>Health and Safety Protocols</i>	<p>1. Those entering the school must wear a mask. The school will provide masks for the students' use inside the school building. Those masks are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • changed at midday • laundered with bleach and dried in a heated dryer every night. <p>-Parents may choose to provide masks for their children to use at school. Those masks must be changed at midday. It is highly recommended that masks coming from home be laundered with bleach and dried in a heated dryer every night.</p> <p>2. Those entering the building must be screened daily at the door.</p> <p>3. Occupants must maintain 3' distance from all others in the classroom and 6' distance from all others outside the classroom.</p> <p>4. Students will remain with their cohort all day in the same classroom.</p> <p>5. Teachers will move to meet with cohorts.</p> <p>6. Spaces will be sanitized between cohort occupation.</p> <p>7. No sharing of classroom materials.</p>	<p>1. Students will enter the building by the main entrance, one student or household at a time while maintaining appropriate social distancing. 2. Students will be wearing a mask to be permitted into the building. 3. Students will be screened at home for symptoms, and at the door for temperature prior to entering the building. 4. Parents will remain outside the building when bringing students to school. 5. Due to the important role of socialization at the preschool, preschool parents will be allowed to enter the building with their preschool students following the preschool leader's guidance. 6. Parents will make appointments outside of the arrival and departure times to meet with the principal or to take care of official tasks with the office. <p style="text-align: center;">Exit:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1.
